### Nun's Way Pavilion Transforming To Meeting Ground

As part of Kettle's Yard Open House, artists Josh Wright and Guillaume Vandame have been working with people locally in the past year to explore and share ways we can all take care of our physical, mental and social wellbeing in our busy lives. They had transformed Nun's Way Pavilion into an inspiring space for you to try something new! Meeting Ground, at the Nun's Way Pavilion was open to the public from Sunday 16 February till Sunday 1 March 2020.

During this artistic intervention offered to the community, there were interesting workshops and activities ran by recognised artists commissioned by Kettle's Yard. Every day there were art activities for all ages with free refreshments, soothing activities and exciting artworks for the community to have a go at and observe, including The Twilight screening of Disney classic Up! with Cambridge Film Festival.

There were also displays of inspiring artworks created by community groups from across North Cambridge, walks and workouts with a twist!

The local community, in the North of Cambridge embraced with jubilation the artistic and cultural encounters.

We all agree that It has been an inspiring couple of weeks. The feedback had been fantastic and level of attendance has been very high. Meeting Ground as a local project involving artist working with the local community has shown that our local community is ready to embrace artistic and cultural encounters and we hope the legacy left behind could contribute to make our community a better place.







Previous research in our local area had shown that there has been a systematic neglect in terms of offering local residents with the opportunity to be expose to artistic and cultural activities. We hope this is the beginning of a more culturally driven community.

NCCP is delighted to announce that has partnered with Cambridge Science Centre to start a new, communitydriven, hands-on programme in North Cambridge.

Cambridge Science Centre runs hands-on exhibits, and interactive shows and activities that allow families of primary and early-secondary school students to experience natural phenomena -not just be told about them- at the Centre's engaging exhibit space at 44 Clifton Road, near the Central railway station. This sparks discussions of everyone's own questions and observations with friends, family, and the Centre's welcoming science communicators. But now, with the help of NCCP, the Centre is expanding beyond its walls. This year, a group of local children and their families will investigate space, the natural world, and more in a series of exploratory workshops held at Nuns Way Pavilion. Through this exploration, the group will produce their own piece of science communication (this could be a short show, exhibit, or artwork – whatever can be imagined!), and the whole community can share this new, exciting knowledge as this piece is brought-to and hosted-by local people at local events. Cambridge Science Centre hopes that this will be the start of ongoing events that it can support in the area.

# **Hello Everyone**

#### An update from your North Neighbourhood Policing Team.

Following the Chief Constable's pledge to increase resources for

Neighbourhood Policing, the North Team welcomed additional officer to the team towards the end of last year. Those officers hit the ground running and have enabled the North team to carry out a host of different work since their arrival.

Operation CARMEL, a roving police operation combatting street-based drug dealing across the city, took place most recently in Buchan Street. Officers from the North team have arrested suspects for drugs offences as well as other crimes, seizing over £5000 worth of Class A drugs and in excess of £1000 in cash as a result of one stop search alone. We have secured several charges relating to drug offences and other suspects remain subject to active investigations. In addition, male from the Kings Hedges area has recently been jailed for 3 and a half years for drug dealing.

Operation ROMERO is being developed in conjunction with the Local Safeguarding Children's Board and is being put in place to identify and work with those children who are at Emerging or Moderate risk of harm. Currently in its early stages, individuals adopted to this scheme will be managed by both schools, safeguarding leads, district Problem Solving

Groups and local Neighbourhood officers. This is envisaged as a redevelopment of early intervention - working with schools, partner agencies and parents to identify and prevent at-risk individuals from being drawn into criminal/violent behaviour.

Operation CAMPLIGHT, targeting a series of ASB and criminal damages earlier in the month after reports were made from local residents. As a result of the operation over 40 vehicles were stopped, intelligence gathered and two vehicles were seized for driving offences. Similarly, Operation HELVELLYN targeted poor driving and this resulted in several arrests, vehicle seizures as well as drivers being reported for driving offences.

We encourage you to get involved with a voluntary scheme known as Speedwatch [http://speed-watch. org] which is primarily aimed at 30 and 40mph zones with the potential to extend this scheme to 20mph zones should demand necessitate it.

#### **COMMUNITY REACH FUND**

The local Youth & Community Coordinator, Paul Connelly, has a **Community Reach Fund** to support projects with children, young people, their families and communities living in Cambridge.

#### What should projects achieve?

Projects must aim to achieve the following: help build community resilience, be beneficial to health and well-being and motivate people to get involved

#### How much can you apply for?

You can apply for up to £1,000. You must be able to evidence how you would match fund a grant by a minimum of 10%. For example, this could be volunteering hours, donations or entry fees such as 50p over the course of the project, or the donation and loan of resources from

other community assets such as your children's centre, school, nursery, library, church etc.




Wonderfully Made Creative Café is a weekly drop-in craft space where it's OK not to be OK.

# Holiday Lunches



FREE lunches and activities for children and families in the North.

Holiday lunches are aimed at families who would either normally be in receipts of free school meals or who find the added expense of feeding the family in the holidays challenging. Sessions start with activities followed by a (usually) hot lunch. Each venue varies and offers a different experience, but all venues offer a warm welcome.

Children are the responsibility of the adult who brings them and we encourage children to ask for their own food and clear up after themselves with support and guidance from the adults.

Sessions are FREE and don't need to be booked in advance. There are no lunches over the Christmas period and not all venues have sessions every week of the holidays, so please do check in advance. Due to the fluctuation in numbers, sometimes there is an abundance of food and sometimes we are trying to stretch food further to feed a larger crowd. We ask that people are patient and understanding.






